Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships offer the chance to learn and gain nationally recognised qualifications whilst earning a salary. As an apprentice you will be working in a real job where you will be employed by a company, have a contract of employment, get paid a salary whilst obtaining valuable workplace skills and experience.



Where do apprenticeships lead?

Your current skills and qualifications will form the starting point for your Apprenticeship journey. Learners starting on an Apprenticeship level 2 can progress onto a level 3 Apprenticeship.

Some learners, depending on qualifications will commence the programme at level 3 and then they can progress onto a Higher Apprenticeship. There are plenty of options on completing an Apprenticeship programme to enter skilled employment and further training or to progress onto a Higher Apprenticeship either part time or full time. HIGHER & DEGREE APPRENTICESHIPS



Higher or Degree Apprenticeships are available at levels 4-7 and they combine work with study. Typically, higher apprentices study part time at college, university or with a training provider. Higher Apprenticeships can take between one and five years to complete and Degree Apprenticeships can take between three and six years to complete.

- **A level 4 or 5** is equivalent to a Higher Education Certificate/Diploma or a foundation degree
- **A level 6** is equivalent to a Bachelor's degree
- **A level 7** is equivalent to a Master's degree

FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIPS

Foundation apprenticeships are designed to provide young people aged 16-21 (up to 24 for those with EHCP) with a pathway into meaningful careers, particularly in sectors facing workforce shortages.

They are not a replacement for existing apprenticeships but offer tailored support to help young people transition from education to the workplace. These apprenticeships typically last a minimum of eight months depending on individual needs. Foundation apprenticeships represent a significant opportunity for young people to gain practical experience and skills whilst earning a wage.

Foundation apprenticeships will cover various sectors, including health and social care, construction, engineering, and digital fields.

STUDY PROGRAMMES

The Study Programme assists 16-19 year olds to gain qualifications and employability skills to progress into further education, an apprenticeship or employment.

It offers a flexible programme which may include a mix of qualifications, including English and maths for young people who have not achieved GCSE 4 - 9, and work experience. Study programmes may be undertaken at a further education college, sixth form college or with a training provider.

T-LEVELS

THE NEXT LEVEL QUALIFICATION

T Levels are an alternative to A levels, apprenticeships and other 16 to 19 courses. Equivalent to 3 A levels, a T Level focuses on vocational skills and can help students into skilled employment, higher study or apprenticeships.

T Level students spend 80% of the course in the classroom, learning the skills that employers need. The other 20% is a meaningful industry placement, where you will put these skills into action. One T Level takes 2 years of full-time study and is equivalent to 3 A levels and is a nationally-recognised qualification.

HIGHER TECHNICAL QUALIFICATIONS (HTQs)

HTQs are an alternative to apprenticeships or degrees.

They may suit you if you want a more practical, employer-led study programme.

HTQs are for students over 18 who want to study a subject to prepare them for skilled jobs. You can study HTQs full time or part time. They are usually taught at colleges, universities or independent training providers.

Approved HTQs are new and existing level 4 and 5 qualifications approved by the Institute for Apprenticeships and Technical Education.

There are many different types of HTQs, such as:

- higher national diplomas
- higher national certificates
- foundation degrees
- higher education diplomas

STEP BY STEP GUIDE TO APPLYING FOR AN APPRENTICESHIP

STEP 1

Decide on the Type and Level of Apprenticeship

Consider your interests, strengths, and career goals

STEP 2

Search for Apprenticeship Vacancies

- Find an Apprenticeship - www.gov.uk/apply-apprenticeship
- Company websites
- Training Providers and colleges
- Other - Some employers may use recruitment platforms, such as Not Going To Uni, UCAS Career Finder, Get My First Job, Rate My Apprenticeships or Tees Valley Jobs

STEP 3

Research Employers

- Read about the company and what they offer
- Check their social media and reviews
- Look for success stories from previous apprentices

STEP 4

Prepare Your CV

- Education and predicted or achieved grades
- Any volunteering, school projects or part-time work
- Extracurricular activities, hobbies or personal projects
- Key skills such as teamwork, communication, and reliability

STEP 5

Write a Personal Statement or Covering letter

Most applications require a personal statement or cover letter. It should explain:

- Why you want the apprenticeship
- What interests you about the company and industry
- Why you are a good fit

STEP 6

Submit your Application

Follow the employer's instructions carefully, which may include:

- Uploading a CV and personal statement or covering letter
- Completing an application form with personal details and qualifications
- Taking a short assessment or aptitude test

STEP 7

Prepare for Interviews and Assessments

If shortlisted, you may be invited to:

- An online or in-person interview
- An assessment day or short test (could be numerical, practical, or physical depending on apprenticeship type)
- Prepare for common questions (why this apprenticeship, what skills do you bring, etc.)
- Practice with a friend or family member
- Show your enthusiasm and willingness to learn

STEP 8

Follow Up and Keep Applying

Persistence is key. If you don't succeed immediately:

- Ask for feedback if you are unsuccessful
- Use feedback to improve future applications
- Apply for multiple apprenticeships

STEP 9

Additional Tips and Resources

- Apply early to avoid missing deadlines
- Tailor each application; avoid copying and pasting
- Use career services for feedback or support
- Keep track of applications to manage deadlines effectively



Remember to always double check spelling, grammar, contact details and tailor your application to each role.

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
